Dear Chairman Johnson and Ranking Member Carper:

We write in support of H.R. 558, a bill to designate the United States Postal Service Facility located at 55 South Pioneer Boulevard in Springboro, Ohio, as the "Richard 'Dick' Chenault Post Office Building."

Richard 'Dick' Chenault served in the Pacific Theatre during World War II. Following his military service, Mr. Chenault spent twenty-three years with the U. S. Postal Service having served as the first letter carrier hired to deliver mail in Springboro. Mr. Chenault also served as a member of the Clearcreek Township Volunteer Fire Department for forty-five years, including twenty-three years as Fire Chief of the Department, and served as a part time police officer in Springboro over the span of three decades when the village had a largely volunteer police force. Mr. Chenault passed away on November 14, 2010.
